CAMBRIDGE ASSESSMENT INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION (CAIE) A LEVEL

The Cambridge International AS and A Level examinations are held twice a year i.e. in May/ June and October/ November, and the results of which are published in August and January respectively. The Cambridge International AS and A Level students are assessed on a grade scale from A* grade, awarded for the highest level of achievement, to 'E' indicating the minimum required performance while 'U' stands for ungraded which means 'Failed' or 'Ungualified' for a grade.

All papers of the Cambridge International A-Level course can be taken in the same examination session, usually at the end of the second year of the course.

WHY CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL A LEVEL?

Cambridge International AS (Advanced Subsidiary) and A-Levels are taken by over 175,000 students in more than 125 countries every year. The A Level course is very flexible, as it offers students a choice of more than 55 different subjects.

Students can choose any combination of the wide choice of subjects that suit their interest and aptitude. Students must take a minimum of three A-Level subjects (3.0 credits) and one AS subject (0.5 credit) in order to qualify to study undergraduate courses. However, they may take more than the required credits depending upon their interests, capabilities and career choice.

- Many universities across the world offer advanced credit (up to one year) to students who hold Cambridge International A-Level qualification, which means that students taking Cambridge A-levels are already ahead in their undergraduate programme by a year before they even begin their college enrollment.
- More than 450 US universities including Harvard, Yale, MIT and Stanford accept the A-Level qualification.
- A-Level is a rigorous programme that encourages high academic standards. It helps students gain in-depth subject knowledge with a deeper understanding, and it also helps them develop independent learning and constructive thinking skills.

Cambridge International A-Level qualification is internationally recognized and valued for being an excellent preparation for university, employment and life. It also opens doors for the students for entry into leading universities worldwide including the UK, USA, Canada, New Zealand and Australia.

Credits

'A' refers to a full two-year course that carries 1.0 credit, and 'AS' refers to a one-year course, which carries 0.5 credit.

The minimum requirement for A-Level qualification is 3.5 credits which mean that students must take at least three 'A' subjects alongside at least one 'AS' subject in order to qualify for admission to reputed universities.

Admission Policy

Eligibility for A Level Study

Students must have passed the Secondary Education Examination (SEE) or equivalent examination in order to qualify for A-Level study. Students who have scored at least Grade B in English, Science, C. Maths (plus Optional Maths for Science stream applicants), in the school's internal SEE qualifying or Class X annual examinations, are eligible to apply for A-Level in Science and Non-Science streams.

Admission is granted to students who qualify in the written tests and interview on condition that an attested copy of the mark sheet of the SEE together with the character certificate is submitted to the college office within the first week from the date of the publication of the SEE results, failing which, admission will be cancelled, and the amount deposited for admission forfeited.

Attested copies of the following documents must be submitted at the time of submission of the application form.

- Mark sheet of SEE qualifying/ Grade X internal examination of the school.
- ▶ Two recent passport size colour photographs.
- ► Certificates of awards or scholarships earned at school, if any.
- ► Migration certificate (Applicable for the students from boards other than SEE).
- A sealed recommendation letter from the Principal/ Vice Principal or a teacher of the school last attended (can also be submitted via email directly to info@qihe.edu.np addressed to the Coordinator).


Note:

Once the student is admitted to the college, admission fees including annual fees will not be refunded incase of cancellation/withdrawal of the admission.

Scholarship and Award Policy



- In addition, students, who stand first, second and third in the terminal examinations will be awarded 100, 75 and 50 percent scholarships in monthly tuition fee for four months. However, the same will be withdrawn if the student is unable to retain the position during subsequent examinations.
- If the performance of the student in any internal examination is not satisfactory, the scholarship granted can be cancelled at any time.
- Decisions regarding the awards of all scholarship schemes are strictly under the jurisdiction of the college management.
- ▶ The management reserves the rights to change its scholarship schemes without any prior notice.
- In order to continuously avail the scholarship, the student/s must maintain good academic and discipline standard on a regular basis throughout the academic session.
- Must have a consistent B grade or above in all internal examinations for continuation of the tuition fee waiver or it will be withdrawn.
- # Must have a consistent E grade or above in all internal examinations for continuation of the tuition fee waiver or it will be withdrawn.

Why Study at GIHE?

International Standard Facilities

We have infrastructure of an international standard supported by the latest technology and state-of-the-art facilities. Classrooms are spacious with multimedia facilities. All the science laboratories viz. Botany, Zoology, Chemistry and Physics are fully equipped with high quality apparatus for practical classes. A computer lab and a well-stocked library have been set-up with the latest editions of books and reference materials. A wide choice of journals, periodicals, and broadband internet facility is available in the library for supporting the students' study and research. A separate multimedia room equipped with an interactive board is at the teachers' disposal to supplement their lectures with visual aids.

GIHE has also been designated as a centre for theory and practical examinations by the Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE), an examination board under the Cambridge Assessment.

Teaching & Learning

We provide students with a stimulating environment for their enriched learning. At GIHE, students not only gain academic knowledge and skills but they also develop their confidence through continuous assessments of their performance. A maximum of 25 students are kept in a class so as to enable the faculty to give students individual attention and care. Students are encouraged to enquire and participate in discussion, and are assessed regularly through unit tests and terminal examinations. Generally, three unit tests and three terminal examinations are given in a year. In addition, project work, presentations, assignments, etc. are given to students on a regular basis to make them responsible, reflective, innovative and engaged.

Students are required to obtain a minimum of 40 percent marks in all the subjects in the overall internal assessment to qualify for appearing in the board examinations or else they will have to reappear in the failed subjects.

Students are also frequently taken on field visits to gain hands-on experience in different subjects. From time to time professionals from different fields such as medicine, engineering, applied science, management, etc. are invited to interact with the students and talk about their professions, to enable students to make a decision regarding their future career.

Parent-Teachers' Meetings

Parent-teachers' meetings, are held term-wise or as per need to share with and discuss the overall performance of the students. Academically weak students are provided extra guidance. Tutorials are arranged for students in the major subjects if the need arises. It is mandatory for the weak students to attend such classes.

GIHE Student Council



General Regulations

Class Hours

Students must arrive in the college at least ten minutes before the class starts. Students, who arrive late by more than ten minutes, will have to report to the Coordinator before being permitted to enter the class. Disciplinary action will be taken as per the college rules against students who repeatedly come late.

Classes are generally held Monday through Friday. Practical work of science and other addition classes are conducted on Sundays or as required depending upon the need.

Attendance

Attendance is taken every day in every period to ensure the students' presence and participation in the class. Absenteeism in the class is discouraged. Coordinators or administrators should be informed in writing in case a student cannot attend classes due to unavoidable circumstances. In addition to maintaining academic requirements, a minimum of 90 percent attendance is necessary for students to be promoted to A-2, the second year of A-Level.

Withdrawal of Students

Mid-session withdrawal is discouraged. However, if a student has to withdraw his/her name from the college due to some unavoidable circumstances, a written application must be submitted to the office at least two months in advance or else extra two months' tuition fee will be realized from the student before issuing a Transfer Certificate (TC) or any other document(s).



Dress Code and Attire

Following the proper dress code is compulsory for all students. They must wear the prescribed college uniform which consists of a white shirt, tie and blue pants during summer, plus a gray coat and the prescribed black sweater bearing the GIHE logo during winter. Black gloves and Black mufflers are also permitted.


Students who come in improper uniform or casuals will not be allowed to attend classes. Students are expected to be attired properly for ECA activities as well.

Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct outlines the expectations of the institution on the way the students need to conduct themselves. The acceptance of admission to GIHE implies the acceptance of its rules and regulations and any deviation or violation of the same will lead to disciplinary action which also entails fines. Parents and students are required to go through the Code of Conduct as well as the Student handbook and comply.

Transportation Policy

- Bus facility is available for students who require the same. Students requiring transportation have to indicate their need, and mention the bus stop in the application form.
- Students are not permitted to bring any sort of conveyance to the college especially two wheelers.
 This rule is strictly enforced for the safety of the students themselves.
- 3. Students availing the bus service will be issued a bus pass cum ID tag, which they must display while boarding the bus and should be kept with themselves at all times.
- 4. If a student has to change the bus stop temporarily or does not require the bus service for any reason, then a written application written/ signed by the parents, addressed to the Transportation In-charge must be submitted and permission obtained in advance.
- 5. Misuse of bus facility in any way will lead to the suspension/cancellation of the same.





Financial Regulations

Billing System

- 1. Fee chart is available separately in the Accounts Office.
- 2. Tuition fee is charged for twelve months beginning from Jestha.
- 3. Transportation charge is payable for eleven months.
- 4. Bills are dispatched one week in advance for the forthcoming month, and have to be settled before 20th of each current month, failing which a surcharge of 5 percent will be added to the bill amount, and 10 percent surcharge will be added for the payment made after two months.
- 5. Students, whose accounts fall into arrears for more than two months, will have their names struck off the register. They will have to seek re-admission on the payment of fees as at the time of first admission. Re-admission of such students will solely be at the discretion of the college authority.

Payment Procedures

Payment of monthly bills of the students can be made as follows:

- 1. Parents/ students may deposit the college fees in cash at the fee counter of the school at Dhapakhel.
- 2. Standing instruction can be used for the payment of the college fees for which students/ parents should have an account in any branch of Himalayan Bank Ltd.
- 3. The fees can also be deposited in any branch of Himalayan Bank Ltd. and Citizen Bank Ltd. by filling in a deposit voucher in triplicate. Once the fee is deposited, the bank sends the record of the payment to the accounts office through email the same evening. However, parents/students are requested to retain a copy of the deposit voucher safely until they receive a computer generated official receipt from the accounts office.
- 4. Parents may deposit the fees through IME by visiting the nearest IME agent outlets and filling out the available fees payment form.


