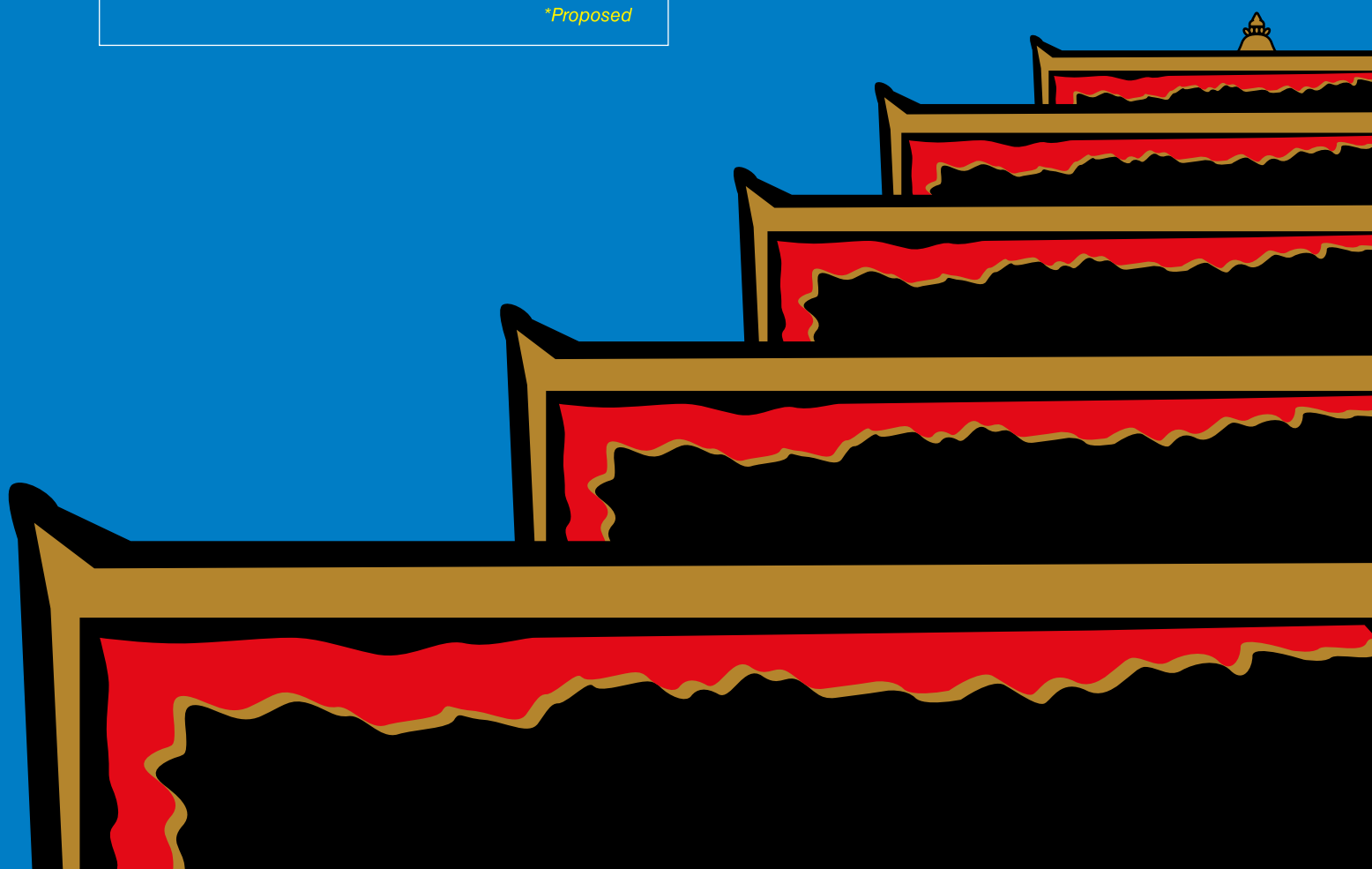

ADMISSION PROCEDURES AND KHWOPA ELIGIBILITY

Students wishing to get enrolled at Khwopa College can collect the admission form, prospectus and all other necessary information from the college administration. Duly filled up admission form accompanied by photos and fees should be submitted back to the administration within the stipulated deadline.

For BBS and BA/BASW, students who have passed the +2 or equivalent examination in Science, Management, Humanities or Education streams are eligible to sit in the entrance exam conducted by the college on the beginning of the academic year.

For BSc. Environment and BSc. Physics, students should pass the TU Entrance Exam. At the time of TU examination form fill up, BSc. student should submit Entrance Score Sheet



EVALUATION SYSTEM

In course of enhancing the students' academic capability through constant monitoring, Khwopa College regularly conducts various assignments and examinations in its academic schedules. Pre Board Examination is conducted at the end of the course completion. Students should pass the internal examinations to appear in the respective Annual/Semester Examination conducted by Tribhuvan University.

1. Assignment

Students are required to complete the assignments given by the teachers within the given time frame.

2. Examination:

For bachelor level students, Khwopa College conducts three examinations in an academic year. Two Terminal Examinations and a Pre Board Examination are conducted by the college. The Weightage of the examinations are as follows:

Accessibility

Khwopa College is maximum 20 minute walk from any of the outskirts of the city. Public bus services viz Kamalbinayak-Kathmandu, Bhaktapur-Langankhel, Bhaktapur-Gongabu, etc. are available which will drop you at Dekocha chowk and the college is only a minute away from the chowk. Students from Sanga, Banepa, etc. can get down at Jagati and walk 15 minutes through the city to the college.

Scholarship

Khwopa College grants scholarships and awards to the talented and deserving students from each faculty. The Management committee based on recommendation made by the concerned committee selects the recipients of scholarships and awards. Scholarships are available for the students admitted in BSc (PCM/PSM), BSc (Env. Sci.), BBS, BA, MBA, MSc (Env. Sci.), MA (Eng.) and MA (Eco.).

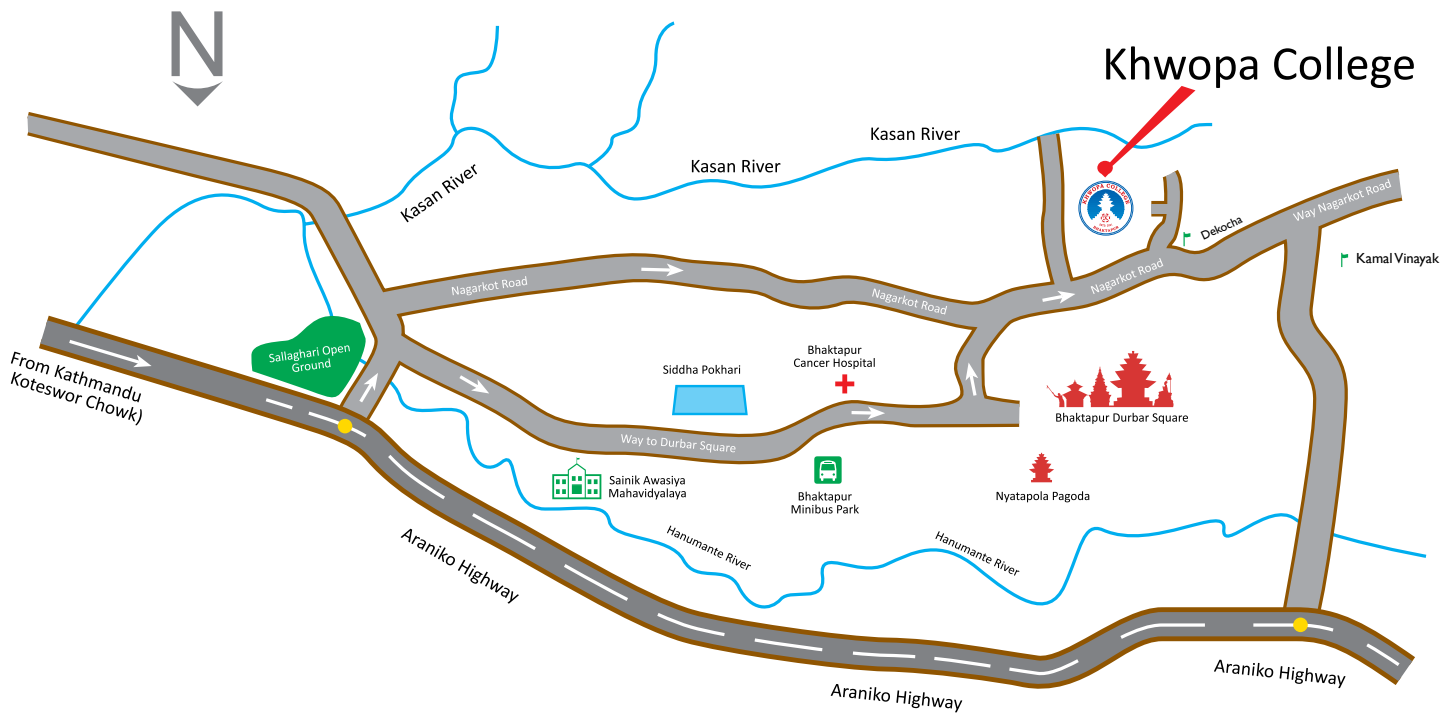
