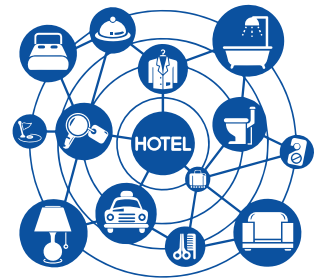


Business Studies Group

Grade B OR above 2.4 GPA above in S.E.E or equivalent examinations. The students must pass the entrance examination successfully.



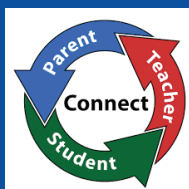
CAREER PROSPECTS

Study materials are made available online. These can be downloaded by students at any time

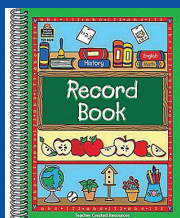


Notifications

Check your attendance daily. Your presence at the college will be updated real time in the system. Absent/Leave Application can also be submitted online.

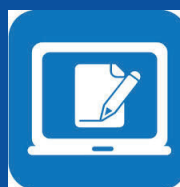


Class Logs

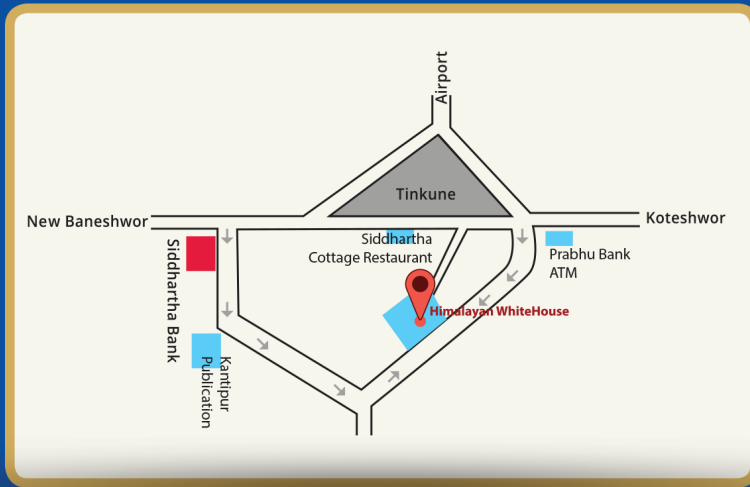
TEACHING METHODOLOGY
