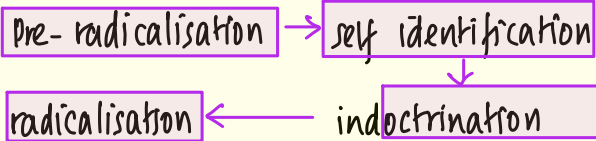

RADICALISATION

Process by which an individual or group comes to adopt increasingly extreme political or religious ideas and aspirations



CAUSES

- 1) Social
 - brain washing; role of family & friends
 - social cleavages
 - religious intolerance
- 2) Political
 - hate speech; polarisation
 - vote bank politics
 - system support
 - role of extremist orgns
 - global influence
- 3) Economic
 - extreme poverty
 - funding
- 4) Technology
 - social media; anonymity
 - fake news, disinformation, propaganda

CONSEQUENCES

- 1) Societal
 - polarisation; marginalisation
 - harassment; cyber bullying; defamation
 - cancel culture
- 2) State
 - extremism; terrorism; lone-wolf attacks
 - anti-national activities
 - mob lynching
 - de-democratisation

CHALLENGES

- difficult to map & predict
- Role of over ground workers (OGWs)
- Balance between security & privacy
- Role & influence of internet, social media
- skewed narrative of radicalisation
- failure of de-radicalisation programs

MEASURES

- counter radicalisation division - MHA
- De-rad programmes
- monitoring cyber space - new IT rules
- Tough policing
- 3-pronged counselling system
 - family - clergy - professionals
- effective counter narratives
- Community based activities
