1. Curricular Aspects	➤ BoS/Academic Council meetings are held from time to time. Faculty members from our college also participate in syllabus revision. ➤ Revised curriculum is aligned with NEP 2020 which is further enriched by • Value-added courses • Add-on skill-based training and • Environment, and ethics modules. ➤ There is provision for academic flexibility as per NEP 2.). ➤ Virtual classes were conducted	➤ The syllabi, prescribed by the parent University, i.e., Kumaun University, Nainital are duly adhered to, and all efforts are made to complete the syllabi well before the examination schedule. ➤ Regular classes are a mandatory feature for each subject. ➤ Every month, the record of the syllabi covered, the percentage attendance of the teaching faculty as well as of the students, in the form of a Key Performance Indicator (KPI), is forwarded to the Directorate of Higher Education, at the end of the month. ➤ Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) is practiced. Periodic assessment of the syllabi covered vis-à-vis the KPI as mentioned above is carried out and corrective measures are taken for the completion of the prescribed syllabus. ➤ The virtual laboratory classes, primarily carried out in the Science faculty, was recognised by the parent body- Indian Institute of Technology, New Delhi, which awarded Certificate of Appreciation to the institute, for achieving the 2nd Rank in the Usage of Virtual Labs for the Semester

		(January) 2025, in the state of Uttarakhand.
2. Teaching-Learning and Evaluation	➤ Teaching and mentoring are the most indispensable part and conducted strictly as per the time table. Remedial classes are held for students in need. ➤ Field visits, internships Project-based learning, group discussions, ICT enabled learning are integral part of teaching in some subjects. ➤ Mapping POs/COs with curriculum is essentially done.	➤ Internships have become an important part of pedagogy, in some of the subjects like Biotechnology, Computer Science, and PG Diploma in Guidance & Counseling. ➤ ICT enabled teaching- learning has made the entire process more interesting. Altogether 12 smartboards and 15 DLPs have been provided to different departments, with majority of staff, adhering to the use of such facilities. ➤ Evaluation of the answer copies during examination is transparent, and is conducted well within the stipulated time span. In fact, the college has become a nodal centre for evaluation of the copies by the parent Kumaun University; and centralized evaluation is catered to.
3. Research consultancy and extension	➤ At present 10 faculties are provided with financial support for different research projects. ➤ The Research Cell conducts the Pre-Ph. D course work mandated for the new entrants, pursuing Ph. Ds. ➤ The research cell is also responsible for maintaining the records of the total number of Ph. D scholars, those receiving the UGC fellowship, etc ➤ The IPR Cell routinely conduction workshop on IPR, and Patents issue for the research scholars	➤ In the AY 2024-25 nearly 10 MoU's at college level, while 04 were signed with the Department of Higher Education for the benefit of all government colleges. ➤ 40 students are Availing UGC Scholarship. ➤ Altogether, around 400 students are pursuing their Ph. D. under the guidance of around 90 faculty members. ➤ 30 students have been awarded with Ph. D degrees (2024-25). ➤ The number of research publications in national and international Journals by different faculty members for the year 2024-25, was 74. Similarly, the number of book chapters was 34, while books published was 8.
4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources	➤ ICT enabled class in 10 departments, few with Smartboards (12). All the department heads are provided with a computer and a laser printer. The Central library has 1,57,586 books and reference text (2024-25).	➤ The students have shown increased interest attending the ICT-based classes. ➤ Catering to the needs of 13,367 students remains a challenge, more so, when the syllabi and subject areas

	➤ Sports facilities extended to the students.	keep evolving. Nonetheless, library effectively manages the needs of the students. ➤ Reading Hall, strengthened with research journals, competitive magazines and books, caters to the needs of the students preparing for different competitive exams. ➤ A number of departments have established book banks for the use of the postgraduate students. ➤ In the field of sports, the college, yet again received the University Vice Chancellor's Trophy (3 years in a row), for the overall best performance.
5. Student Support and Progression	➤ Scholarships, is disbursed to meritorious students through Govt. funded CM Protsahan yojana; while SC, ST, OBC, Minorities, EBC students received scholarships from the Central funded Schemes. ➤ Career counseling and placement cell organizes regular workshops, Job fairs, invited talks, for the students. ➤ Remedial classes for the SC & other minority students is conducted by the SC Cell. ➤ Entrepreneurship development workshops are undertaken with active student participation under govt. sponsored Devbhoomi Udhyaamita Yojana. ➤ Anti-Ragging, and Sexual harassment (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Cell, Students Grievance Redressal Cell, caters to the redressal of the students' grievances. ➤ Further, the CM Helpline portal coordinator at Level -1 (college level), similarly redresses the complaints addressed through the CM Helpline portal. ➤ Regular Student feedback and Students' satisfaction reports is conducted.	➤ State government through CM scholarship schemes has extended scholarship to both UG and PG classes. In the year 2024-25, the number of such students was 312, amounting to scholarship disbursed equaling Rs. 67, 42,000. ➤ Similarly, under the Central-sponsored schemes, altogether 2297 students, belonging to SC, ST, OBC, minorities, EBC received the scholarship. ➤ 80 students have got employment/Job (2024-25). ➤ Around 55 of our students have qualified one or the other exams like UGC-NET or CSIR-UGC NET, JRF, GATE, SLET, GAT-B, UTET I and II etc. ➤ 82 students were enrolled as Ph. D scholar for the year 2024-25, while 29 students were awarded Ph. D degree. ➤ 19 students have been University Rank holders (Gold Medalist), in the year 2024-25 ➤ 51 students undertook the Computer Hardware and Networking and maintenance training workshop at MSME Technology Centre, Electronics Service and Training Centre (Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India), Kamiya, Ramnagar, for nearly 1 month duration.

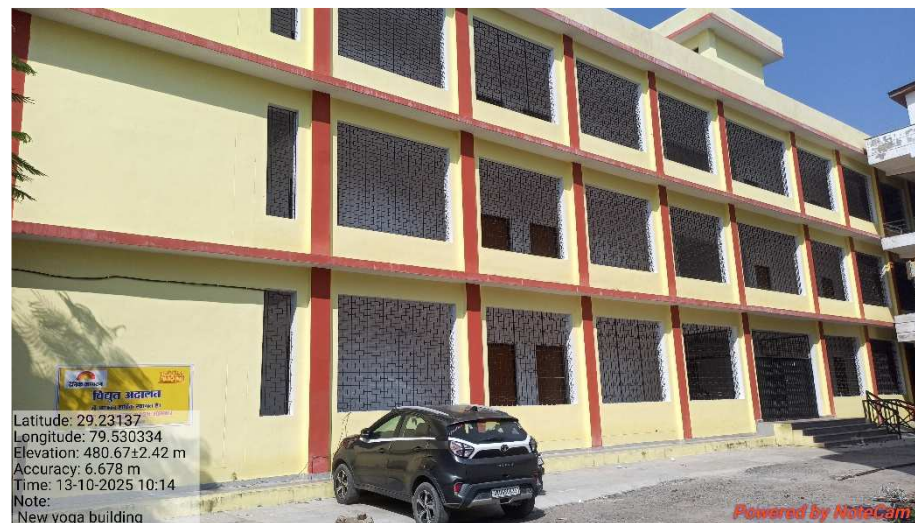
	➤ Students' internship programme, conducted by different departments. ➤ The institute got enrolled as Youth Red Cross Group/Institution of the prestigious Indian Red Cross Society, Uttarakhand (Certificate No- 501000478). ➤ Seminars, workshops, expert talks were organised ➤ Establishment of eGranthaalaya ➤ PTA meets were organised	➤ Similarly, 10 students enrolled in M. Sc Biotechnology, took 6-months long internship in Moulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi, Lok Nayak Hospital, New Delhi, & Dr. Ayub Qadri, Islamic University of Science & Technology, Awantipura; and additional 12 students, enrolled in PG Diploma in Guidance & Counseling, undertook 3-month long internship in Govt. Sushila Tiwari Hospital. ➤ 49 students took part in the EDP (Entrepreneurship development programme, and attended the workshop. ➤ This year (2024-25), altogether 9 grievances were redressed (1 by the Sexual harassment (Prevention, Prohibition, & Redressal) Cell, and 8 by the CM Helpline portal coordinator. ➤ Many of issues were raised by the students through Student feedback and Student Satisfaction Report, and remedial measures taken earnestly by the administration, principally as relates to teaching, completion of the syllabi well in time, and other needs such as number of books issued by the library. ➤ Seminar and conferences have been a routine feature now, with two international conferences organised by the Department of History and Sociology, while one national seminar was organised by the Department of Education. ➤ eGranthaalaya has been established, and subscription to both online as well as Offline journals, for the use of the research scholars and the faculty has been strengthen. Subscription to DelNet (in the absence of Inflightnet, which ended this year) was done. Similarly, the college got registered to the Central Scheme of ONOS (One Nation One Subscription). These efforts have certainly eased the problems of the research scholars, enrolled in the college.
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		➤ PTA meets were held, and the recommendation of the parents/Guardian were redressed. The parents expressed their satisfaction related to marked improvements made in the supply of water to the lavatories, as also regular clean up. The number of sanitary pad disposal machines now is more than 7.
6.Governance, Leadership, and Management	➤ Participative management is done through committees, IQAC, and departmental meetings. ➤ Statutory committees are constituted to carry out various administrative-related tasks. There are core committees for Admission, Examination and evaluation. Besides these there is a student's union. the other committees are: the proctorial board, the anti-ragging cell, Students Grievances Redressal Cell, IQAC, the Research Cell, Sexual harassment (prevention, prohibition, and redressal cell), Anti-ragging Cells, Career Counseling Cells, and SC Cells. Altogether, 59 committees have been constituted, and relegated with the responsibilities. ➤ E-governance in administration, finance, and examination makes work more transparent and easier to administer. Regular professional development and training for faculty & staff are incorporated in the system. Financial transparency through regular audits by government and other agencies is carried out.	➤ The overall management of the college is responsible for inclusive decision making, quality enhancement, and organised functioning of college activities. ➤ Committees are relegated different responsibilities to ensure smooth administration, uphold rules, protect student rights, and maintain academic quality. Each such committee or individual head/coordinator carries out its respective duties, diligently and independently, as per the norms. ➤ E-governance has become a more rational way of carrying out administrative tasks making the decision-making process more transparent and accountable, and has improved efficiency in academic and administrative operations. There is an increased faculty competency through continuous training. ➤ As relates to the teaching faculty, altogether 7 faculties were facilitated with awards a recognition- While Dr. Deepa Singh received the Sparsh Ganga Shiksha Shree Award, Dr. M C Pandey received the Sangeet Ratan Award, and Soni Tamta was awarded a patent. 4 faculties received the Mukhya Mantri Utkrishta Shodh Patra Prakashan.

Our college is a small campus but it has more than 60 different species of plants. ➤ Signages, regarding the information dissemination have been placed in the campus. ➤ Plantation drives are also run by Committees like the Eco Club, NSS and NCC, Alumni, preferably in the week-long celebration of Harela. ➤ The Sexual Harassment (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Cell is actively involved in raising concerns such as sexual harassment, women health, Child abuse, etc, through invited lectures, and holding competition, chart making, etc. This year, on the occasion of International Women's Day, an expert talk was delivered by the renowned author, Mr. Ashok Pande. ➤ Health check-up and blood donation camps were organised by NCC, as well as the Alumni. ➤ Stronger Community Engagements was encouraged during the 7-day long NSS camp, where 5 villages were adopted by the NSS.
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The newly built Girls Hostel with 75 rooms, fully furnished and with attached toilet, bathrooms, will house 225 students- awaited final clearance from the government body.
