Institutional Best practice No. 1 (2024-25)

1. Title of the Practice: Mobilizing the support of the Organisation with whom the college has signed MoUs

A number of workshops were organised soliciting the support and expertise of the different academic or otherwise, organisation with whom the MoU were affected, for extension of collaborative support. Consequently, a number of these organisations undertook workshop, and other activities. Some of these activities could be highlighted here, in brief;

- i. <u>Objectives of the Practice</u>- To enhance the learning chances of the students through exposure to related fields of study, not usually covered in their courses.
- ii. <u>The Context</u>- The experts from outside, through their talks prove two things in particular-(i) Something extra from the routine classwork, (ii) Extension of the infrastructural base available with the collaborative partner is made available to the students.
- iii. <u>The Practice</u>- The likely partner is invited to the college or the particular department to discuss the modalities, or the principal objectives or the expertise, which would form part of the mutual agreement. Subsequently, the MoU is signed. Towards actual implementation of the provisions as enshrined in the MoU, the MoU partner is then invited towards finalisation of likely workshop, or expert talks, etc, and the date is fixed.
- iv. Evidence of Success- All the workshops, or the invited talks remain very well attended.
- v. Problems encountered and resources required- None

Institutional Best Practice No. 2 (2024-25)

Title of the Practice- Entrepreneurship development programmes or workshop for the students

- i. <u>Objectives of the Practice</u>- To develop entrepreneurship among the students, so that they are enabled to start their own business.
- ii. <u>The Context</u>- To render the interested students to either learn the art or trade by giving them exposure, say training workshops, or rendering them the expertise through experts in the field, say, Industries, local artisans, and like, thus strengthen the knowledge-base of the students, eventually leading them to start their own enterprise.
- iii. <u>The Practice</u>- The college has an already established Entrepreneurship development Cell, mandated with the task of organising the boot camp to mobilise the interest students, to subsequently participate in the 12-day long workshop. At the level of the college itself, 5 of the faculty members have already attended the workshop in the Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII), Ahmedabad. The other aspect of the entrepreneurship, involves taking the help of the MSME Technology Centre, Ramnagar (with whom MoU has been signed) to undertake organisation of training workshop on computer hardware, networking, and maintenance.
- iv. <u>Evidence of Success</u>- The separate workshops, organised by Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) and the Computer Science department in association with the MSME Technology Centre, Ramnagar, were successful, since 49 students participated in the 12-day workshop organised by EDC, and 51 students participated in the month-long MSME Technology Centre aided training programme.
- v. <u>Problems encountered and resources required</u>- Out of the 49 students, a final 7 students got the financial support to visit the institutes like Doon University, or the Patanjali Plant Research Institute. It was felt that a larger number of students should be encouraged, and thus give them greater exposure. In the case of MSME aided workshop, organised in the college premises, itself, additional number of tools, hardware could have made the training workshops more successful.
- vi. <u>Additional notes</u>- While EDC workshops have become a routine annual features, additional entrepreneurship-related workshops or expert talks, should be organised, and more often.
